THANKSGIVING PET SAFETY

KEEP OUT OF PET REACH:

- Raw poultry
- Turkey skin and raw/undercooked turkey
- Butter and oils
- Bones, especially cooked bones, which are likely to splinter
- Alcohol: beer, wine, or anything else
- Nuts, especially walnuts or macadamia nuts
- Sweets like cookies, pie, and cake
- Onions, or anything with onion in it, even if the onions are cooked
- Garlic
- Some mushrooms (to be safe, avoid all mushrooms)
- Sage and nutmeg
- Dough
- Chocolate

OK TO SHARE IN MODERATION:

- Turkey, boneless
- Sweet potato or yams (no onions or cream)
- Canned pureed pumpkin
- Raw apple (but not the seeds)
- Raw veggies like carrots
- Steamed veggies like green beans or broccoli
- Any rice, brown, white, or wild

OTHER TIPS:

- Provide toys or treats to entertain pets
- Limit human foods to pet-safe ingredients and small amounts only
- Make sure IDs are on in case a visitor allows an accidental escape
- Remove or secure tempting trash
- Know where your closest pet emergency is in case of problems
